Retrospective report: 25th March- 8th April



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3 rd April	In an <u>article</u> written for <i>The Times</i> , NHS Chief Executive, Sir Simon Stevens, said that the <i>"speed and precision"</i> of the coronavirus vaccine rollout has shown the NHS at its best and that he is determined to apply the same lessons to the way the NHS supports targeted prevention and tackles other health crises such as cancer, heart attacks, strokes and mental health. He said that the pandemic has <i>"accelerated"</i> and demonstrated the benefits of joining up services, adding that this <i>"goes with the grain"</i> of the reforms to integrated care systems.
6 th April	According to a <u>piece</u> by the <i>Health Service Journal</i> , members of the social enterprise sector have written to the Health and Social Care Secretary warning him that NHS officials are already pushing social enterprise providers out of the service because of the government's proposed changes to the NHS and social care. The legislation expected to be put forward this spring will loosen competition and procurement rules and encourage integration among Integrated Care Systems (ICSs) however this has raised concern among members of the social enterprise industry who say this has already led to contracts being taken away from social enterprises.
7 th April	On 7th April, the leader of the Scottish National Party, Nicola Sturgeon, set out her party's plan to 'remobilise, strengthen and protect' the NHS ahead of the Scottish elections in May. Sturgeon said that half of all spending on frontline NHS care would go to GPs and community services if the SNP is re-elected. In addition, the party would set up an expanded network of 10 centres to deliver diagnostic work and elective operations. To help reduce waiting times, she also pledged to increase in-patient, day case and out-patient activity to 10% above pre- coronavirus levels levels within a year, and maintain that level for the rest of the five-year parliamentary term.
